

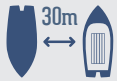
SAFETY



Wear your life jacket! Even though you may not fall in yourself, a life jacket could help you if you need to rescue someone else.



Keep to the right. Always keep right when travelling along the River and approaching other vessels.



Keep well clear of other boats and rowers. Please be courteous to fellow river users, especially keeping a safe distance of least 30m from all other boats.



Beware of shallow waters! If you can see the bottom it's too shallow. Keep distance between your vessel and the shoreline. Remember if you run aground the skipper is liable to pay you for any repairs.



Only stop at designated stops on the map. Be very careful when pulling wharves along the River. Approach carefully, tie up securely, and have someone remain with the boat at all times.



Use common sense when operating the Boat. If you have any questions please call us at anytime. Even from out on the River.

INSTRUCTIONS

GoBoats are easy to sail. They are very stable and have a top speed of less than 8km/hm which is a fast walk. That's why anyone can steer the boat, and it's why you don't need a boat licence. All boats are equipped with electric motors and batteries which means no smells or pollution.

Each boat has a GPS tracker and remote cut-off switch which can be activated by GoBoat staff at any time they believe there is a risk to safety or security. Steer the boat by holding the tiller which is attached to the motor.

Gripping the handle, you can turn clockwise for forward and anti-clockwise for reverse. The more you turn the handle the faster you will sail. To navigate the boat, pull or push the tiller in the opposite direction of the way you want the boat to go. If you pull the tiller towards the left, the boat will go right and vice versa.

Please do not venture into those areas which are marked in red on the map, as we may have to remotely disable your boat and your time would be wasted. Please remember that the boat may be reserved by guests after you, so it's important to return the boat at your agreed time. That will help you avoid paying a penalty for late return too. Most of all, have a great time and enjoy all that Victoria Harbour and The Yarra River has to offer!

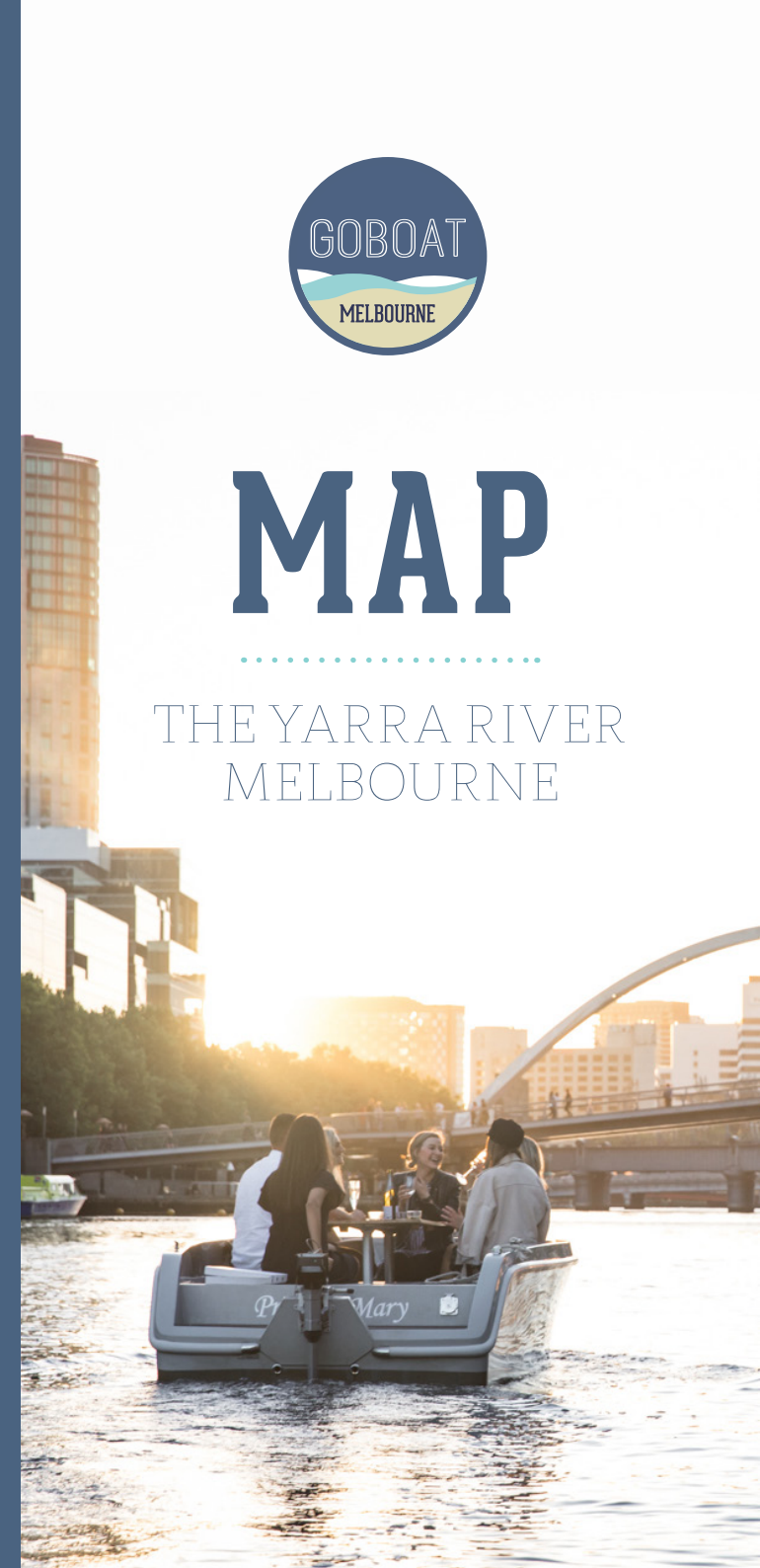

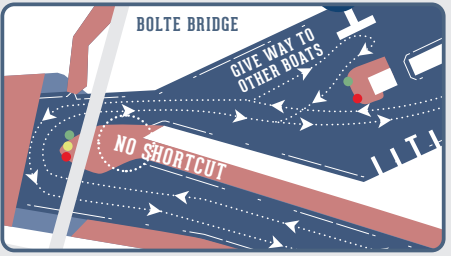
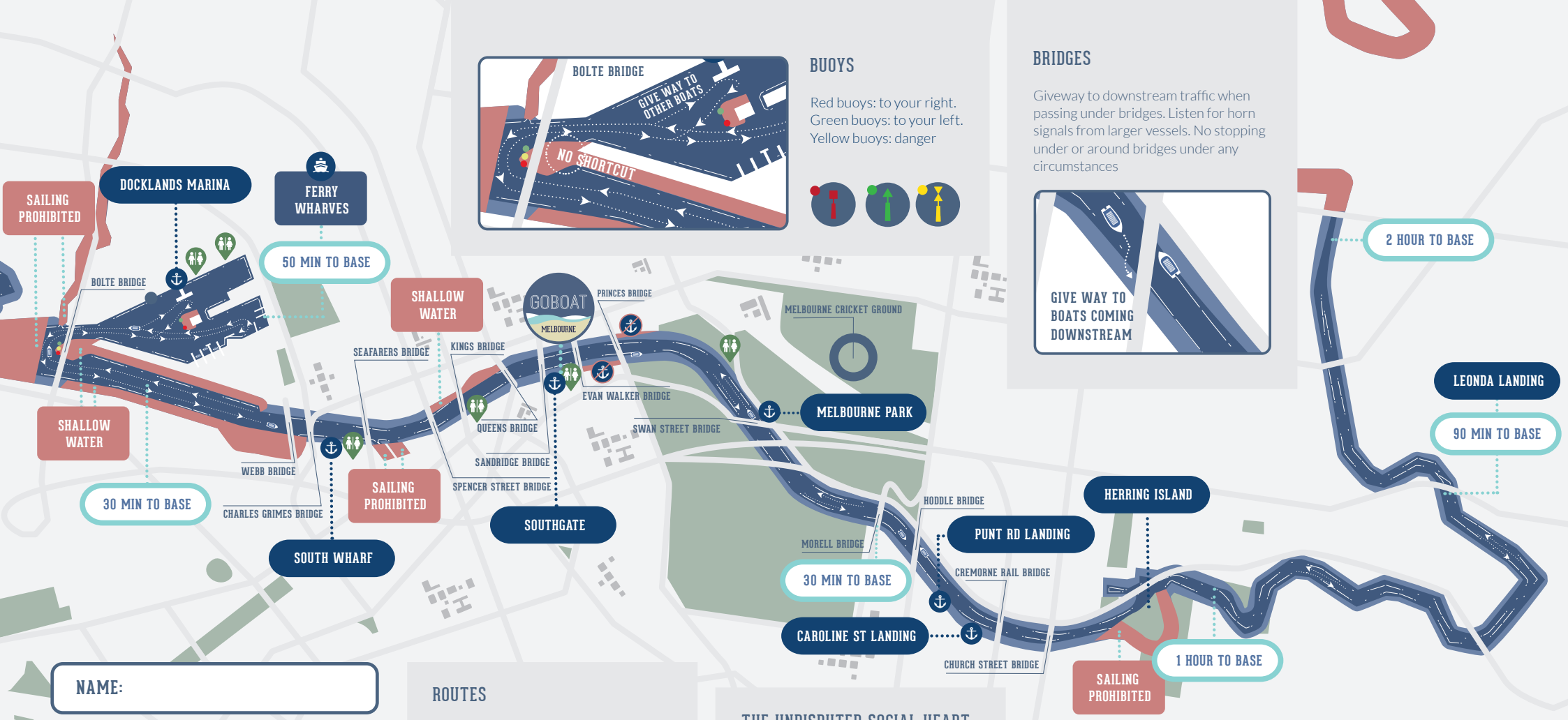

BUOYS

Red buoys: to your right.
Green buoys: to your left.

BRIDGES

Give way to downstream traffic when passing under bridges. Listen for horn signals from larger vessels. No stopping under or around bridges under any circumstances

ROUTES

There are no set routes around the Harbour and along the Yarra. We believe everyone should be able to experience their GoBoat at their own pace. Pay close attention to time markers on the map and make sure you arrive back by your return time.

Remember it's important to follow the guides on the map overleaf and always stay to the right, giving way to boats travelling downstream under bridges. Don't travel more than 50m past the Bolte Bridge when entering and exiting Victoria Harbour.

Give way to boats coming downstream under bridges. Where possible pass under the right side of bridges.

THE UNDISPUTED SOCIAL HEART OF MARVELLOUS MELBOURNE

The Lower Yarra River stretches where the city of Melbourne was established in 1835. From its source in the Yarra Ranges, it flows 242 kilometres west through the Yarra Valley which opens out into plains as it winds its way through Greater Melbourne before emptying into Port Phillip Bay.

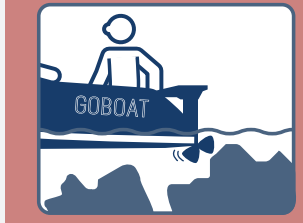
The river was a major food source and meeting place for indigenous Australians from prehistoric times. Travelling The Yarra River in a GoBoat offers a fantastic perspective of Melbourne's cityscape and some of Melbourne's most famous sights.

All boats have a visible identification number. We reserve the right to end the voyage if we receive information about any rules being violated.
